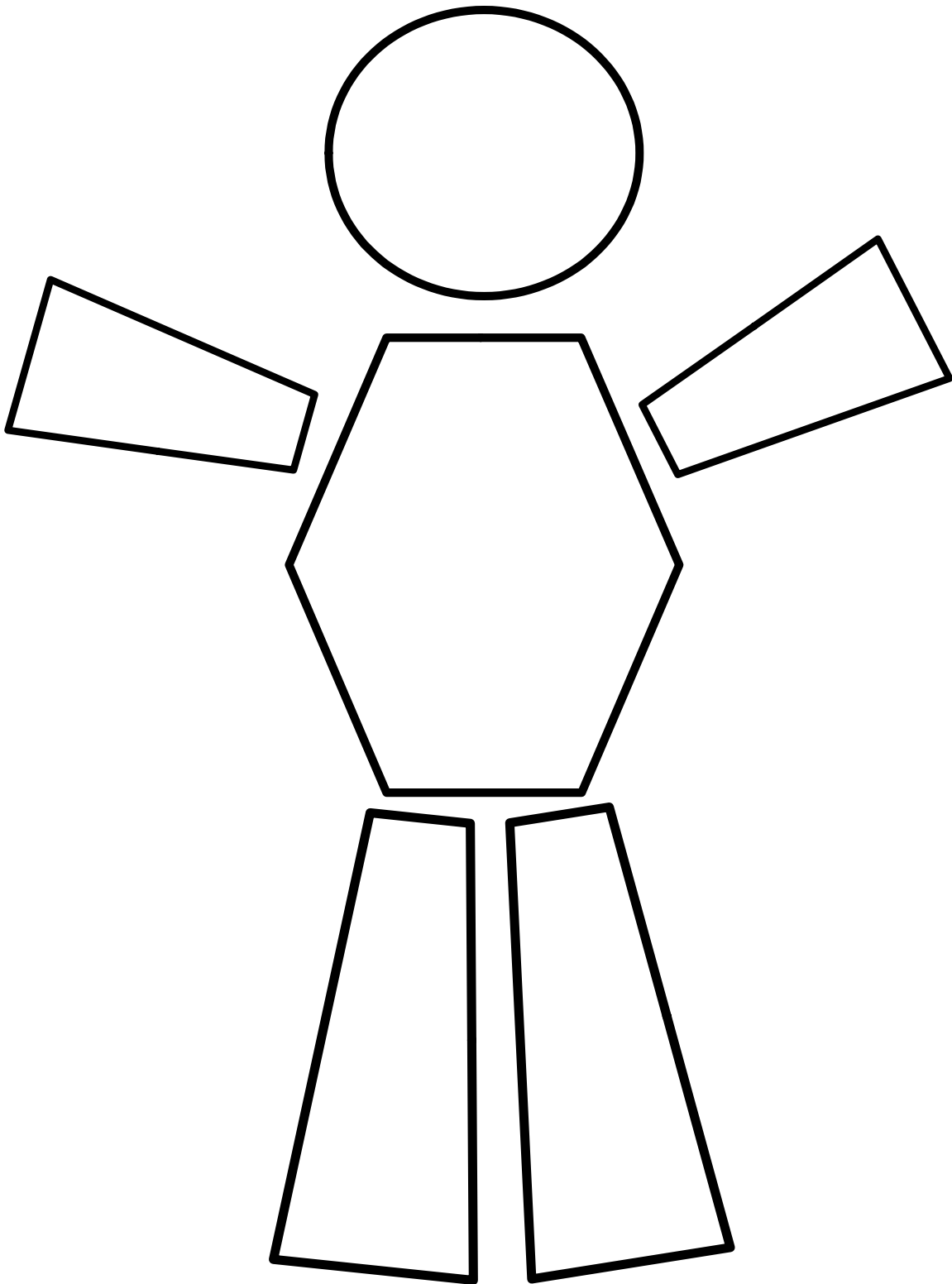


War - numbers are from 0-5. Each player lays down a card drawn from their down turned stack, highest number wins - play until stack is gone. Count the cards, the person with the most wins.
